ON COURSE COMPETITIONS & PRIZES

- **Pink Ball** - £1 - Each team will receive a pink ball with which each player agrees to use for the duration of the one hole each alternately. The team that brings the pink ball back to the clubhouse at the end of their round with the lowest net score will receive a prize.
- **Beat the Pro** - 5th Hole - £5 - If your ball lands nearer the pin than the pros ball you will receive double your money.
- **Nearest the Pin** - 7th & 13th Hole
- **Nearest the White Line** - 8th Hole - A white line will be drawn on the fairway and the ball deemed to land nearest to the line will win.
- **Power Play** - 12th Hole - £1 - A chance to play the hardest of two flag positions of which if you net par or less you will double your points for the hole .
- **Hole in One** - 17th Hole - The first person to achieve a hole in one will win a car.

Rules of the Day

DRESS CODE

At the request of the Organisers, all attendees are requested to **wear a touch of PINK** whilst abiding by the following;

On the Course: Formal golf attire (golf trousers/tailored shorts with white socks, collared shirt & golf shoes)

In the Clubhouse: Smart Casual – no trainers, beach sandals, golf shoes, ripped jeans, collarless shirts, football/rugby shirts etc.

FORMAT OF PLAY – TEXAS SCRAMBLE BETTER BALL

Four person teams playing four balls but each shot comes from the same spot (the best of the four drives is chosen and all four team members then hit from that spot, and so on). At least four drives of each member of the team must be used during the course of the round so at least four drives hit by Player A, four by Player B, and so on.

HANDICAPS

Each player will give a genuine handicap based on their ability up to a maximum of 28 for men and 36 for ladies. A team of four will calculate their collective handicap, divide by 4 and multiply by .75 to achieve their overall team handicap. i.e. Player One has a handicap of 10, Player Two has a handicap of 15, Player Three has a handicap of 20 and Player Four has a handicap of 25. Their combined handicap is 70. Divided by 4 and multiplied by .75 = 13.125. All handicaps will be rounded down so the teams resulting handicap is 13.

SCORECARDS

Scorecards for the competition will be available on the day from the Registration Desk.

HOLE IN ONE

In the event of the ‘Hole in One’ competition being won, the competition for that prize will be closed immediately. Additional prizes will not be offered.

BEST NET & PINK BALL

In the event of a tie for the ‘Best Net Team Score’ & ‘Pink Ball’ Competitions, the best score over the last 9, 6, 3 holes etc will decide.

HOW TO PLAY USING STAPLEFORD RULES

When you are playing stableford golf rules, points available for the hole you are playing are allocated as follows:

- 5 points - 3 strokes under your adjusted par (albatross)
- 4 points - 2 strokes under your adjusted par (eagle)
- 3 points - 1 stroke under your adjusted par (birdie)
- 2 points - Your adjusted par (par)
- 1 point - 1 stroke over your adjusted par (bogey)
- 0 points - 2 strokes or more over your adjusted par (double bogey)

To calculate the stableford points you have scored, you need to use a combination of your golf handicap alongside both the par and the stroke index allocated to each hole you are playing. The stroke index of the hole can be found by viewing the scorecard of the golf course you are playing.

The number of strokes a scratch player should take to complete the hole is known as the par for the hole. The degree of difficulty of each of the holes on the golf course is known as the stroke index. Stroke index 1 is deemed the most difficult hole to play, with stroke 18 being the easiest.

If you are a golfer with a golf handicap of 18, you are allocated 18 additional shots during your round, one per hole. A golfer with a golf handicap of 6 would receive 6 shots, one on each hole with a stroke index of 1 to 6. If your golf handicap is over 18, you receive additional shots. A golfer with a 28 handicap receives a shot on every hole in addition to a shot on every hole with a stroke index of 1 to 10.

If you are playing stableford golf, you are entitled to pick up your ball if you score 2 over your adjusted par as you cannot do any better or worse, and you can resume play on the next hole. Once you have completed the 18 holes for

the round, all the points you have scored are added for each 9 holes and totaled for the 18. If you have more points than the other golfers you are playing with, you are declared the winner.
